Built in 1876

The church was in the Diocese of Sale which was formed in May 1887, with the Omeo area coming into the Diocese from Sandhurst (Bendigo) about 1910.

It was decreed that there needed to be a priest effectively working either side of the snow line throughout the winter. Beechworth priests were not able to visit their Gippsland congregations in such conditions.

Dargo was frequently listed as part of the Bairnsdale Parish which was declared in 1883.

Bishop Corbett was the first bishop conducting confirmations there in April/May of 1888.

Excerpts from.....The Sunday Herald 2nd. of December, 1990

Called to tell it on the mountain

He may not ride a horse these days, but the high country priest still sits tall in the saddle as far as his parishioners are concerned.
Peter Philp reports

As the town of Dargo draws into sight, Bill Caffrey swings the car on to a side track and begins the 20-minute run down to the Lasick brothers' property (the Lasick story was featured in last week's *Sunday Herald*).

He leaves me at the gate and goes in to spend time with Mat and Ed Lasick. During this time he gives them holy communion, which he has carried up from Maffra.

Half an hour later he emerges from their cabin.

"They've always been loyal to their faith. At one time they'd ride a horse to mass. The story goes that they would share the horse. While one rode, the other would walk for a while."

"What time is mass in Dargo?" I inquire.

"About 5.30," says the priest. Everything here starts "about".

EVEN the Easter Sunday mass, that draws well over 100 people, starts about 11.30am. The Easter Sunday religious celebration shares the day with the climax of the Dargo Walnut Festival.

"Everything has to fit in with the festival, even mass," laments the Mons.

Lesley remembers the days of first communion for the children. The nuns would come up to Dargo to instruct the children, but the parents were also involved in that preparation. It served as family evangelisation. Everybody had to brush up on their faith, and when the big day arrived the priest would drive up from Maffra, and Dargo would celebrate.

But there are no young children in Dargo any more. So first communions are also belong to an era past.

But today is not the Walnut Festival, and the congregation is down to a handful. The only reminder of walnuts is the huge tree in the church grounds that in season is the source of fund raising for the parish.

It is an intimate mass. The priest and the people are very much one. The next celebration together will not come until after Boxing Day.

Lesley Websdale is a convert to Catholicism. She changed her tradition when she married. Her husband worked in the timber industry until the town's only mill closed nearly two years ago.

About 20 families left Dargo when the logging was stopped.

This town has never had a resident priest. The locals wish it could be different, but it appears not to have affected the moral and spiritual values of the families as Lesley proudly expresses: "I don't think they've suffered. None of our kids has got involved in drugs. They are all good-living people and that has always been the way."

The Dargo district has always been identified with the pioneer land-owning families: the Treasures, Trails, Scots, Phelans and Hurleys.



Colleen Hurley almost missed her monthly communion. She had rushed into town between stock-herding jobs, caught a glimpse of Bill Caffrey and realised that it was mass day. There was no time to change; it was straight into church.

The Hurleys, apart from their timber and cattle connections, have run the Dargo pub for generations. Colleen came to the high country as a young bride from Glenmaggie. It was a tough adjustment; she had to give up jobs, regular family contact and an active social life.

But what has deeply affected the family is the lack of secondary education. Like a number of Dargo women, Colleen has had to set up another home near a college. In the old days, Catholics could depend on local boarding schools, but now they must send their teenagers as far as Ballarat.

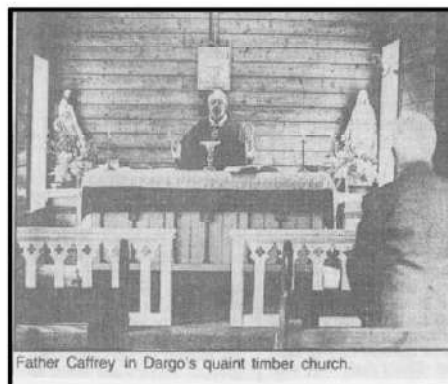
Vince and Nell Phelan have also paid the price of isolation. Their children left home at 12 to go to boarding school in Ballarat and Sunbury. On completion of their education, the young Phelans did not want to return to Dargo.

As Vince drew close to retirement he had to sell much of his land, which he regrets.

He recalls when Omeo had two Irish priests who would make the eight-hour trip on horseback to Dargo for mass and include "sick calls" on the way.

The Mons checks his watch. It's time to hit the trail to Maffra. There could be hospital calls to make back home, and as the dusk draws in the wildlife hazard increases on the road down the mountain.

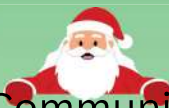
But, unlike his predecessors, Bill Caffrey does not have to make the descent on horseback.

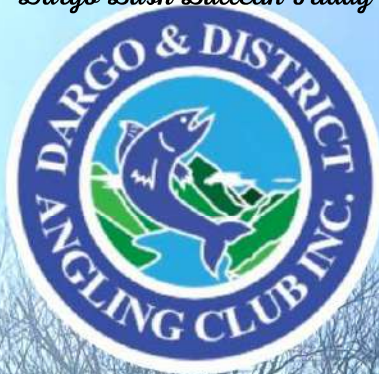

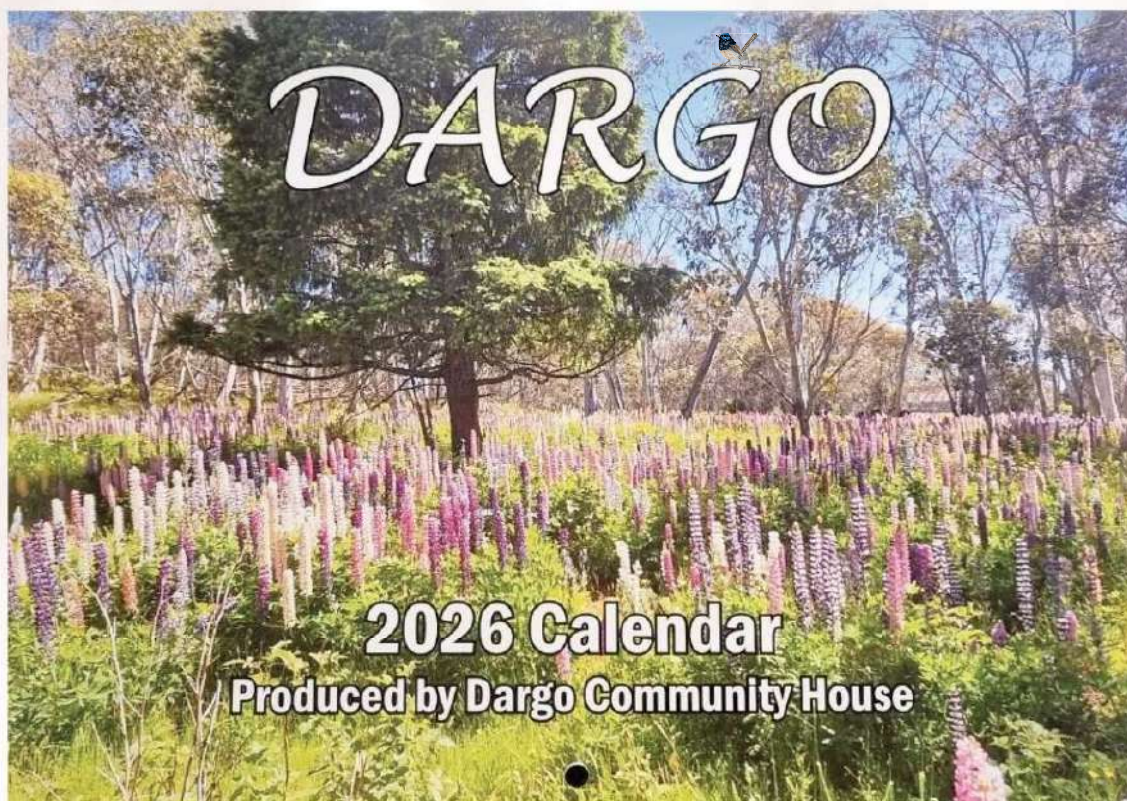


The new Community House kitchen was installed last weekend. A huge thank you to Fred Tay and Liz for their wonderful work – it looks amazing.

White Christmas Slice



RECIPE

A classic White Christmas recipe made with just 6 ingredients - white chocolate, Rice Bubbles, dried cranberries, sultanas, coconut and almonds... all in less than 10 minutes!



Ingredients

- ☐ 500 g white chocolate
- ☐ 1 ½ cups (45g) Rice Bubbles or any puffed rice
- ☐ 160 g dried cranberries (craisins)
- ☐ 140 g sultanas
- ☐ 120 g slivered almonds toasted
- ☐ 1 cup (90g) desiccated coconut

Instructions

Conventional Method

Grease and line a 20cm x 28cm rectangular slice tin and set aside.

Melt the white chocolate in a large microwave-safe bowl (on 50% power for 3-4 minutes or until melted - stir every 30 seconds).

Add the Rice Bubbles, dried cranberries, sultanas, slivered almonds and desiccated coconut and stir to combine.

Spoon into the prepared tin and press down firmly.

Place into the fridge for 3-4 hours (preferably overnight) before cutting into slices.

Store in an airtight container in the fridge for up to 1 week.

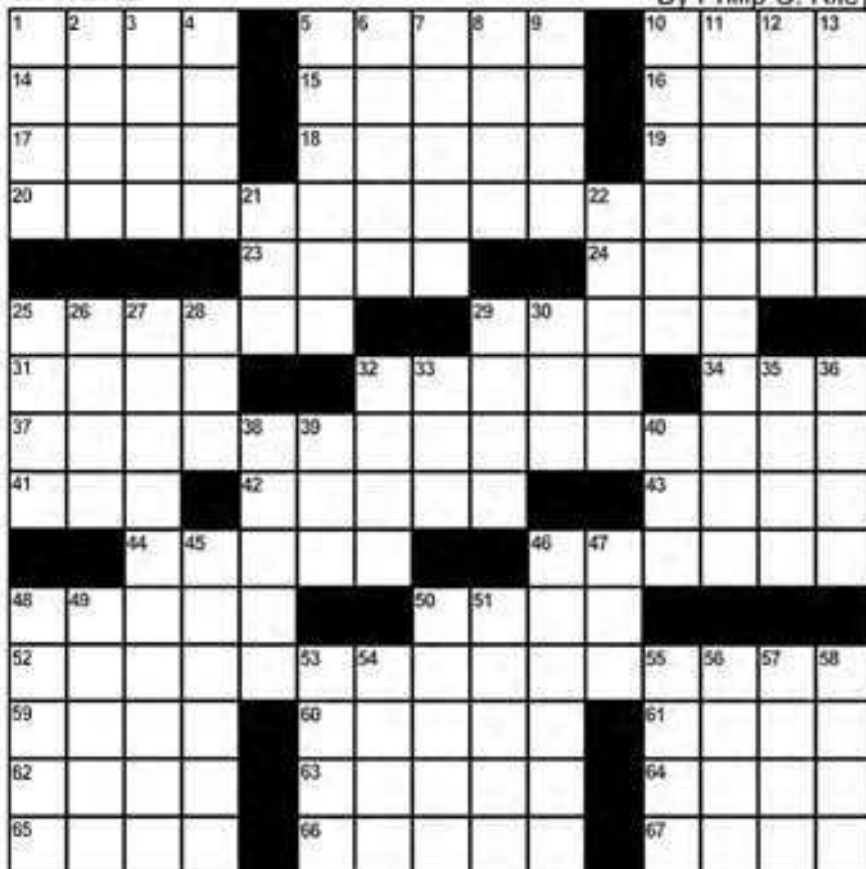

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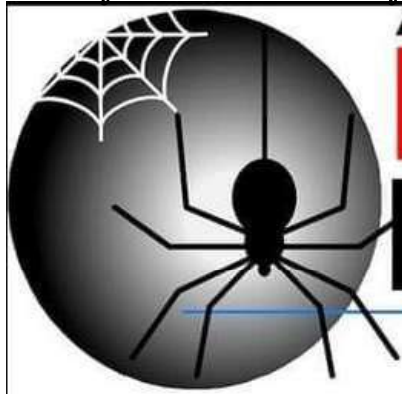
