# 8. INVITED ADDRESSES, PRESENTATIONS OR ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

COUNCILLOR STEPHENS acknowledged the visit of the Governor of Victoria, Professor the Honourable Margaret Gardner AC, to the Shire. Councillor Stephens and the Mayor met with the Governor of Victoria in the Yarram area. The Governor of Victoria was impressed with the reception and dance presentation she received at Wulgunggo Ngalu and the Star of the South (Southerly Ten) team in Yarram who provided an overview of the project. They also visited the mural by Heesco which the Governor's predecessor commissioned and which was donated back to the community.

COUNCILLOR STEPHENS acknowledged Esso/ExxonMobil's great information session which occurred at the Yarram Country Club on Tuesday 25 February in relation to the decommissioning project for the Bass Strait. Of the nineteen platforms, twelve will be decommissioned, whilst the remaining gas platforms will remain for some years. Councillor Stephens encouraged all interested parties to review the available YouTube film clips on the extraordinary process which will be undertaken from 2027 to remove the platforms using The Pioneering Spirit vessel 'Polaris Explorer' measuring approximately 385m in length.

COUNCILLOR FOAT acknowledged the Governor of Victoria's tour of Gippsland's agricultural sector in the Wellington Shire. The trip consisted of 2 parts – a visit to the Hussey Farm who produce Australia's finest gourmet baby spinach leaf and salad mixes and the Hillside Dairy which operates a robotic dairy. The Governor was impressed by the tours and what is 'on the doorstep' in Gippsland. Councillor Foat thanked Hussey Farm and their employees as well as Alister, his family and employees at Hillside Dairy.

COUNCILLOR BANNERMAN also acknowledged an aspect of the Governor of Victoria's visit with the tour of the ASH Timber Mills in Heyfield. The native hardwood industry has been shut down, but ASH Timber Mills has impressively found a way to pivot away from the native hardwood industry and launch into new avenues, including the 'mass timber' which is compounded hardwood timber being created into structures that can be used for infrastructure construction, as opposed to concrete and steel.

COUNCILLOR TATTERSON attended the launch of the new project to support wellbeing in regional communities which was also attended by Councillor Lowe and Councillor Ripper. It is a new research project funded by the Gardiner Foundation with research led by the University of Canberra with support from the University of Southern Queensland. The studies will occur across the Stratford area and then be applied across the broader Wellington Shire and other areas, for which the learnings will be applied across the whole State of Victoria. Councillor Tatterson congratulated the Stratford Community Group for achieving the funding and thanked the Gardiner Foundation for making it happen.

COUNCILLOR ROSSETTI acknowledged the significance of the Governor of Victoria's visit, highlighting that the Governor sees and experiences, in great detail, the many activities and initiatives undertaken by local community and industry in the regions. The Governor also made a major visit to the RAAF Base and the Gippsland Agricultural Centre in Bairnsdale where there was a round table to discuss the region's challenges. One of the common challenges identified during many of the visits was education. Given the Governor's background as a former Vice Chancellor at Monash University and RMIT, she showed particularly interested in this area and offered some suggestions for moving forward. Councillor Rossetti believes the Governor of Victoria will return with a deep understanding of what is occurring in the region and can bring this level of awareness to those in power in Melbourne, particularly the importance of how regional industries, such as those in Gippsland, contribute to the standard of living experienced by those living in the cities.

## 10. DELEGATES REPORT

COUNCILLOR TATTERSON provided an update on the Southern East Australian Transport Strategy (SEATS) meeting held in Queanbeyan on 20 and 21 February, that he attended with Councillor Arthur Allen from East Gippsland Council, Councillor Adele Pugsley from Latrobe City Council, Mayor John Schelling from South Gippsland Shire Council and Councillor Ben Lucas from Baw Baw Shire Council. It was a very informative and productive couple of days.

A presentation was conducted by the Managing Director of Freight Victoria and the Manager of Policy and Strategy which focussed on freight and travel time. SEATS identified their priority projects and Freight Victoria acknowledged SEATS in advocating for progress on the Traralgon bypass and issues with Longwarry and further east, as well as acknowledging the bridge strengthening works that have been undertaken on the Sale alternate truck route to allow transport vehicles to take the shorter route, rather than rattle through Sale. Councillor Tatterson was the Acting Chairperson for the last meeting and Councillor Patricia White from Shoalhaven Council has been elected Chairperson for the upcoming 2 years. Councillor Tatterson will forward the minutes from the meeting to Chris Hastie, General Manager Built and Natural Environment.

COUNCILLOR FOAT and COUNCILLOR MADELEY provided an update on the Gippsland Art Gallery Advisory Group Committee which was held last night where they reviewed the upcoming Autumn exhibition launch and discussed future exhibition strategies. The Autumn exhibition will launch on Friday evening and is open to the public on Saturday and features a diverse range of works including the 'Gifted 3' which is a collection of gifted artworks donated to the gallery. The art of Annemieke Mein, Borun and Tuk collection, Portraits from the Collection and 'Bad Kids' project, a collaborative project with Regional Arts Victoria. The most notable exhibition this time around is Peter Wegner's 'The Centenarian Series', a series of 100 portraits of individuals over one hundred years of age.

Part of last night's committee meeting was to discuss 'blockbuster' exhibitions. Coming up in winter will be the Turner Exhibition. These blockbuster exhibitions attract substantial attention and large audiences and play a key role in promoting and increasing the visibility of the Gippsland Gallery with much economic benefit to Sale and surrounds during the time of these exhibitions, as observed by many business owners and operators in Gippsland.

COUNCILLOR BANNERMAN provided an update on the discussions and considerations of the Timber Towns Victoria committee which met on 20 February 2025. It kicked off with a presentation from the Healthy Forests Foundation, an "up and coming" advocacy group with a vision to shape how forests are looked after.

Discussions then focussed on illegal logging with the idea to submit to the Federal Government a requirement that all timber be tested for point of origin to avoid receipt of imported timber that is purporting to be Australian grown and would likely not meet Australian standards or conditions for timber growing, employment and forestry standards. The committee also discussed the impact of feral animals on the forestry industry and, in particular, the growing deer populations. The committee discussed the need to move to formally recognise deer as feral animals.

Lastly, the committee is requesting that all Timber Town Victoria members and their associated councils remember to register, when possible, any concerns about roads in the Timber Industry Roads Evaluation Study (TIRES) Report that goes to the State and Federal Government to build the case for funding of roads and bridges from State and Federal funding.

COUNCILLOR BANNERMAN provided an update on the Audit and Risk Committee which was held on 24 February 2025. It was a lengthy meeting in which many matters were covered. Some of the highlights included the election of the Chairperson, Chris Badger; receipt of a Human Resources management report; receipt of a report from Council's new Coordinator of Work, Health and Safety which covered his initial observations of Council's

Work, Health and Safety position; adoption of a thirteenth strategic risk onto the risk profile matrix (a statutory and regulatory requirements risk); and receipt of financial reports. The committee received a very positive update on Council's level of protection against threats in the ICT and Cybersecurity space. The Committee also discussed the Local Government Performance Reporting Framework, a state government mandated requirement which is very heavy on Council resources to self-report against ever increasing parameters.
