8. INVITED ADDRESSES, PRESENTATIONS OR ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

COUNCILLOR MADELEY acknowledged the opening of the Nakunbalook Art Show held at the Nakunbalook Environmental and Cultural Education Centre in Sale. This exhibition showcased a stunning collection of paintings and sculptures and local artists' interpretations of the Grandfather Tree, a reference to 'Nakunbalook', a Gunaikurnai word meaning Grandfather gumtree, which stands for knowledge and place. These ancient redgums hold deep cultural and ecological significance in the region. Councillor Madeley extended a thank you to the organising committee of Cindy Tong, Dawn Stubbs, Sharon Ray and Glenn Finlay.

COUNCILLOR MADELEY acknowledged National Tree Day which was celebrated on Sunday 27 July 2025 with a community planting event at Flooding Creek. There were 60 volunteers who together planted around 1000 native plants, including 80 endangered Grey Billy Buttons which is part of the 'Raising Rarity' project (a partnership with schools, Sale Botanic Gardens and the Royal Botanic Gardens of Victoria). By the end of the week with the help of 200 local students, 22,100 native plants had been added to the Flooding Creek area. This event was part of a Green Links grant from the Victorian Government and supports Wellington Shire Council's ongoing revegetation program.

COUNCILLOR MADELEY attended the inaugural TAFE Gippsland Education Awards which were held at the Wedge in Sale on Friday. This was the first time TAFE Gippsland have formally recognised their outstanding community of local students, trainers and industry partners and demonstrates the important role vocational education plays in building local skills, supporting regional industries and opening up new opportunities for the community. There were two award recipients from the Wellington Shire; Cameron Leadoux won Apprentice of the Year for Food and Fibre, and Tate Chisholm won Apprentice of the Year for Carpentry.

COUNCILLOR MADELEY acknowledged the Gippsland Writers Festival that she attended in Yarram where a lunch event was held with acclaimed author Nikki Gemmell. She noted that the annual festival is a vibrant part of the Wellington Shire arts calendar.

COUNCILLOR MADELEY congratulated Councillor Wells who has been awarded life membership of the Sale-Maffra Cricket Association. This prestigious honour is a testament to his outstanding service, dedication and long-standing commitment to the growth and success of local cricket. Councillor Wells has left a lasting legacy, a truly well deserved honour.

COUNCILLOR WELLS attended the Rural Councils Victoria conference held over 2 days in Yarrawonga last week. Low-income housing and the contentious fire services levy were strongly discussed, along with budgeting difficulties faced by smaller councils with increasing CPI set against rate caps. On a positive note, the Wellington Shire's "The Middle of Everywhere" promotional campaign was praised by other Councils.

COUNCILLOR LOWE acknowledged Darcee Young, an outstanding member of the Sale Small Bore Rifle Club. Darcee has made a tremendous impact on the club, both a talented rifle shooter and a kind and humble young woman.

At just 15 years of age, Darcee holds 6 state records and has represented Australia overseas and has now moved to Melbourne, having been awarded a scholarship to the Victorian Institute of Sport in Maribyrnong. She will be the only athlete at the Institute representing the sport of shooting and will receive specialist training from the best shooters in Victoria.

COUNCILLOR RIPPER acknowledged the recent visit by 8 Councillors to the East Sale Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) base. Base Manager, Mr Jim Sutton, escorted the Councillors around the base. Councillors visited the No. 1 Flying Training School unit, followed by the School of Air Traffic Control. Councillor Ripper had the enjoyable experience of flying in the PC21 simulator.

COUNCILLOR RIPPER attended the Grey Wolf awards at Morwell on Saturday, the Cub Scout's highest honour in the Cub Scouts section of the Scouts; the pinnacle of scouting at this stage, and a milestone in scouting life. There were 4 young recipients from the Wellington Shire; Levi, Harry, Ivy and Lincoln.

COUNCILLOR RIPPER also acknowledged the Ben Cruachan Walking Club 60th Anniversary and her attendance at the 60th Anniversary dinner in Maffra. Many members were in attendance. It is a wonderful group within the Wellington Shire, contributing to fitness and better mental health outcomes. Councillor Ripper thanked the club for her invitation to the dinner.

ANGELA WIEBENGA – submitted five questions online to Council. The Chief Executive Officer acknowledged receipt of the five questions which have been distributed to Councillors.

The Chief Executive Officer provided a summary of the questions raised by Angela Wiebenga.

- The initial question related to the proposed amendment of the Local Law and public bathrooms, which has been a previous agenda item, focused on how Council deals with threatening behaviour and the LGBTIQA+ community;
- the second question was in relation to promoting local Church groups on the Middle of Everywhere website and Council's position on this;
- the third question related to the Council Community Assistance Grants Program, an allocation of \$5000 to a local church group to run a leadership program and seeking clarification on guidelines and assessment criteria for how Council undertake assessments for the grant program;
- the fourth question related to Council rates and 'rateability' for one of the local church groups and their assets;
- the final question requested information on how much Council has spent on advertising with the Gippsland times.
