BACKGROUND

I wish to express my concern regarding the recent decision by the Department of Transport to reduce the speed limit on Stratford-Maffra Road from 100 kph to 80 kph. This decision, made without prior community consultation, is deeply concerning and underscores the ongoing neglect of state-controlled road infrastructure.

The deteriorating condition of state-controlled rural roads is a direct consequence of years of underfunding, leading to a growing disparity between metropolitan and regional transport priorities.

Rather than implementing speed reductions as a short-term measure, the Department of Transport should focus on adequately maintaining and upgrading its road network to ensure the safety and well-being of all road users.

Meaningful engagement with local communities on such significant decisions is essential to maintaining public trust and ensuring fair and effective transport outcomes.

It is imperative that the Department of Transport demonstrates a stronger commitment to regional communities by addressing these long-standing infrastructure issues. Rural residents deserve better, and their voices must be heard in decisions that have a direct impact on their daily lives.

This motion seeks to ensure that The Hon. Melissa Horne, Minister for Roads and Road Safety, and the Department of Transport engage more transparently with local communities, provide clarity on their decision-making processes, and commit to meaningful infrastructure improvements that prioritise road user safety.

STAR OF THE SOUTH COMMUNITY ADVISORY GROUP

COUNCILLOR WELLS provided an update from the Star of the South (Southerly Ten) Community Advisory Group meeting on 5 February 2025.

The advisory group is currently submitting to the State and Federal Government their environmental reports. The committee hope to receive a response around Christmas. Twenty-five reports have been sent so far.

Soil surveys, more environmental studies and noise monitoring at Reeves Beach will be occurring.

There will be Gippsland Offshore Wind days held at:

- Port Albert on 12 March 2025
- Golden Beach on 13 March 2025
- Sale on 22 March 2025, and
- Leongatha 27 March 2025.

The committee is speaking with VicGrid about project delivery from 2028 to 2030. There are continued conversations with land owners and there is continued debate about above ground or below ground infrastructure. The first windfarms must be done by 2032. Councillor Wells hopes to facilitate a meeting with the new Wellington Shire councillors to get everyone 'up to speed' on the current status and the process.
