Description Location : Section of Princes Highway between Dawson Street and Raglan Street in the town of Sale. (RNE 100626)

Mixed avenue of trees comprising Canary Island Date Palm (*Phoenix canariensis*), Silky Oak (*Grevillea robusta*), oaks (*Quercus ceris*, *Q. palustris* and *Q. lusitanica*), elms (*Ulmus purpurea* and *U. louis van houtte*), Golden Ash (*Fraxinus excelsior* 'aurea' and Field Maple (*Acer campestre*). Later plantings include Claret Ash (*Fraxinus raywoodii*) and poplars (*Populus monilifera* syn. *canadensis*).

History The avenue was originally known as the 'Centenary Plantation' a reference to the centenary of permanent European settlement in Victoria (1934-35). The planting was designed by Robert Johnstone, Gardens Curator for the Sale Town Council (1). The avenue of trees was possibly renamed following the death of King George V in 1936.
