Description A large brick Bungalow style house, set within an extensive allotment. The house is characteristic of the period with the pair of gables on the main facade combined with the strong horizontal line created by the verandah (a section of which has now been filled in). The windows are paired, except for the four-sided bay window which is a feature of the main façade.

The house is externally largely intact, with the main change being the infilling of a section of the verandah. In 2004, the fence has been altered and the large birch has been removed.

Statement of significance The house at 6-8 Macalister Street, Sale is of local aesthetic and historic significance to Wellington Shire. The house, large by Sale standards, contributes to the heritage of Sale as an example of

bungalow architecture typical of much of the 1920s residential development in the City of Sale. The house and garden are part of a group of larger residential properties on this section of Macalister Street. Historically, it is important for its long association with the Henebery sisters, well-known local identities. (RNE criteria D.2, E.1 & H.1)
