Description An asymmetrical weatherboard house of simple form but unusual details demonstrating fine craftsmanship. The chimneys have tapered brick tops and plain bargeboard emphasise the projecting bay which is decorated with two bands of scalloped weatherboards.

Statement of significance The house at 479 Raymond Street Sale is of local aesthetic and historic significance to Wellington Shire. Aesthetically, it is a good example of a 1920s weatherboard house demonstrating excellence in building with features of design interest including the chimney caps, barge boards and bands of shingled timber boards, all unusual features for houses in Sale. It has historical interest as an example of the work of the well known local builder, Jack Mallet, who, with other members of his

family, built many houses in Sale, and built this house for himself. (RNE criteria A.4, E.1, F.1 & H.1)
