**Description** This symmetrical Victorian house has elaborate entry door and front windows complete with sidelights and verandah returning to the rear Edwardian wing addition. Decorative treatment appears to be original and includes eaves brackets, fine cast iron lacework and moulded red brick chimneys. The garden appears to contain early plantings, including a large lilly pilli tree.

The house is intact and includes an Edwardian addition to the rear with enclosed verandah.

**Statement of significance** The house at 190 Macarthur Street, Sale is of local aesthetic and historic significance to Wellington Shire. Aesthetically, it is a symmetrical Victorian house which is as an excellent example of solid

brick residences built for the established residents of Sale during the late nineteenth century. Edwardian additions illustrate changing styles and the adaption of the buildings to new uses. The property is also significant for its historical associations with MLC (Gippsland), G. M. Davis earlier this century. (RNE criteria E.1, H.1)
