Description Built in solid red brick, the form of this hall is simple and almost ecclesiastical in design. Two-tiered buttresses articulate the facade and the sides of the building and rendered caps match the window lintels. The tripartite windows with small horizontal casements are similar to fenestration in many educational buildings during the Federation era and combined with the chimney to the rear, indicate the non-religious use of the building. The facade features a rendered sign naming the building Annie Pain Memorial Kindergarten Hall.

Condition & Integrity: The hall appears to be externally intact to its original design, in excellent condition.

The Kindergarten was built at a cost of 875 pounds, and was named as a memorial to Mrs Pain, wife of the first bishop.(1) Mrs Pain was for many years president of the Ladies Benevolent Society.(2) It may have been built or extended by Jack Wain, an important local Sale builder.(3)
