Description Two storey Art Deco building, purpose designed for 'tyre service'. Strategically located on the main highway through Sale. The building consists of two sections with rounded corners facing perpendicularly onto the corner, overlooking the carport and driveway area. The rendered detail on each facade is similar, with stepped parapet wall and central 'cascade' motif dividing the moulded inscription: Beaurepaire Tyre Services Pty Ltd.

Condition & Integrity: Good condition. Size of canopy reduced and 'landscape' area added in recent years. Since 1994, changes have included installation of a glass panel partly enclosing the portico area, extensive signs associated with the current business.

History In the first land sale of the newly titled township of Sale in 1850, Messrs Patrick and George Turnbull, who held established mercantile interests in Port Albert, purchased sections 1 and 2 which included this allotment 18, Section 2.(1)
