Description Miss Patons Arcade extends between and includes the double-fronted Chalmers real estate agency and a bookstore. Shops also front the arcade.

From Raymond Street the group of shops is distinguished by their curved parapets, the detailing varying slightly on the northern parapet. The metal framed shopfronts, made by Federal Foundries of Brunswick Street, Fitzroy, remain. They feature square corner display cases, and are an unusual survivor.

The arcade group is fairly intact externally, with the major changes including the shop front to 229-231, cladding over the tile work on the Chalmers shop, and an inappropriate colour scheme for the complex.
