Description Delbridge Hall is a simple design constructed of red brick with rendered dressings on openings, buttresses and parapets. Tinted glass rectangular windows signify the use as a hall rather than a church. The hall is in excellent condition and has minor additions, including a red brick wing that has been added to the side of the building and a new roof.

The hall is one of a number of buildings associated with St Paul's Church of England in this area, which include the adjacent Victorian house that was once occupied by the Dean of the Anglican church, the Chapter House at the corner of Cunninghame Street and the Cathedral.

History Delbridge Hall, which forms part of the complex of buildings associated with St Paul's Church of England complex, was designed by the firm Clegg, Miller and Morrow, an architectural firm responsible for the design of several church buildings in Sale including the Divinity Hostel (now part of St Anne's and Gippsland Grammar), the Methodist parsonage and a kindergarten for the Presbyterian Church.(1) The foundation stone of this hall was laid in 1914.(2)
