

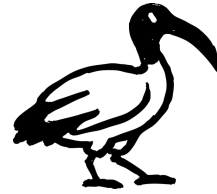
Coming soon... Separating your glass!

Victorian councils are introducing separate glass disposal because state law mandates a four-stream system by 2027 to improve recycling quality.

Broken glass can contaminate the paper and cardboard in your yellow recycling bin. By keeping glass out of mixed recycling, we're creating cleaner, more valuable materials that cost less to process over time.

This change isn't just about tidying up; it's about transforming trash into treasure and supporting Victoria's circular economy goals.

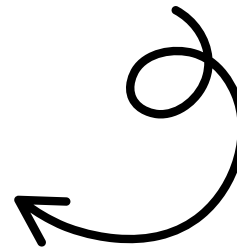

YELLOW BIN RECYCLING

Turning yesterday's cereal boxes and dog food cans into tomorrow's cereal boxes and dog food cans.

- Paper and cardboard
- Plastic bottles and containers (crunchy, not scrunchy!)
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminium drink cans, spray cans, trays and foil
- Steel food and spray cans
- Don't forget to keep recyclable items loose and out of plastic bags



RED BIN LANDFILL

The less we send here, the better. Let's keep this bin exclusive!

- Plastic bags (eg. shopping, garbage and bread bags)
- Disposable coffee cups
- Broken crockery
- Window or mirror glass (wrap it to keep our landfill legends safe)
- Disposable nappies
- Polystyrene
- Clingwrap and plastic wrapping
- Disposable gloves
- Plastics with no recycle code
- Teabags
- Pet poo
- Vacuum dust and dryer lint
- Tissues and single use personal care items



GREEN BIN FOGO

If it used to live or grow, it's FOGO! We're looking at you, wilted spinach.

- Meat, fish and bones
- Fruit and veggie scraps (including citrus)
- Leftovers
- Bread, cake
- Dairy
- Grass clippings
- Weeds
- Garden cuttings
- Leaves



HAZARDOUS WASTE

Ever wondered how NOT to blow up a garbage truck? For tricky items like asbestos, chemicals, sharps, paint, and gas cylinders, we've got the lowdown on safe disposal. Flip the page and scan the QR code for more.



E-WASTE (anything with a battery or a plug)

Old computers, laptops and phones, light bulbs, large appliances like fridges and washing machines, small appliances like toasters and hairdryers, toys with batteries, medical equipment and more!

E-WASTE IS HIGH MAINTENANCE AND REQUIRES SPECIAL TREATMENT

E-waste is recycled for free at any of our transfer stations. Smaller items like phones, batteries, ink cartridges etc can be dropped at the Port of Sale or the Yarram Hub.
